Purpose of the Heights High School Vocal Music Department

- To promote the highest possible standard of excellence in performance, professionalism, and pride in oneself, the choir, the Vocal Music Department, the school and the community.
- To support student learning and development as musicians and choristers.
- To provide a constructive and beneficial activity for student participation and expression.
- To encourage school spirit and pride.

Student Objectives

- Practice and demonstrate proper classroom procedures and choral rehearsal techniques.
- Practice and demonstrate proper vocal technique (posture, breath management, resonance, vowel production, tone quality, etc.).
- Practice and demonstrate proper choral techniques (vowel unification, balance, precision of onset and release, clear diction, dynamic control, flexibility, articulation, timbre and blend).
- Demonstrate evidence of developing musicianship (interval recognition/production, tonal memory, rhythmic accuracy, phrasing, solfege, music reading ability).
- Rehearse and perform songs in several styles, genres and languages.
- Actively engage in public performances.

Behavior and Conduct

- Members of the choir must remember that they are in a visible position, and as representatives of the school they shall behave in a dignified manner at all times.
- Attitude is important to the effectiveness of choir rehearsals and performances. The audience can see and often hear a lack of enthusiasm. The choir is a place where the problems of the outside world do not apply and the student can simply enjoy singing.
- Since the tongue is a major component of proper vowel/tonal formation, as well as proper diction, students are instructed to avoid piercing their tongues. Students may not wear any facial piercings for the performances. All piercings must be removed for performances. Failure to do so will result in sitting out the performance and losing all participation points with the corresponding impact upon grades.

Course Requirements

- Participation in all rehearsals and concerts.
- Effort to improve vocal technique, choral technique and individual musicianship.
- Positive attitude towards and commitment to the choir as demonstrated by effort and achievement in rehearsal and performance.
- Minimum 2.0 GPA maintained to participate in field trips.
- Subscription to the Remind.com text messaging and email system

<u>Materials</u>

- Pencil Pens are not acceptable.
- Folders will be provided and are to be stored in the choir room.
- Proper attitude. Have it on the first day and make sure to hang on to it!
- Proper concert attire.

<u>Performance</u>

- ALL PERFORMANCES ARE MANDATORY.
- Dress rehearsals are MANDATORY in order to participate in the concert.
 - Please refer to the attached Choral Events page for dates, times, and performing groups.
- All conflicts must be submitted in writing and signed by a parent or guardian well in advance of any concert event or no points will be awarded.
- Changes and additions to the scheduled events listed on the HHS Choral Events sheet will be made known as soon as possible.

<u>Grading</u>

- Students are graded on a point system
- Points are awarded for participation during class, dress rehearsals and performances.
- Assessments will be both written and performance based.
- Student work on projects will be assessed using a rubric. Student performance on written work and homework will be determined using a percentage.

<u>Concert Attire</u>

- Students who arrive inappropriately dressed for a concert will either be penalized academically or not be permitted to perform. This includes natural hair color.
- Singers and A Cappella Choir uniform bond fee due by September 27, 2019.
- Uniforms will not be issued until your fees have been paid.

Uniform Cleaning

- Choir Women Black Dresses
 - o Dresses must be washed immediately after each concert, No Dry-Cleaning
 - Dresses are hand washable/gentle cycle in cold water. Hang on a plastic hanger to dry.
 - Do Not Put In The Dryer. Do Not Iron.
- Singer Women Dresses
 - Dresses are not to be washed or dry-cleaned.
 - After each performance gently wipe the inside of the neck and underarms with a baby wipe.
 - o Dresses are to be stored inside out in the garment bag.
- All Men
 - Shirts must be cleaned immediately after each concert. Machine wash/dry or dry-clean
 - o Iron as necessary to eliminate all wrinkles.
 - All other men's piece must be kept clean and odor free. Dry-clean as necessary.

Uniform Maintenance

- No alterations are to be made on any uniform piece. Contact Mrs. Sudduth if you have a fit problem.
- All uniform pieces are numbered and assigned to specific students. NO pieces are to be traded or switched.
- Uniforms are distributed on a hanger, clean and in good condition. They must be returned the same way.
